Dear 2005 SSS Sailors,

Welcome to the 2006 season! This is your invitation to join SSS for another enjoyable year of shorthanded sailing. The race dates are set, the sailing instructions are printed, and your officers are ready to make sure this year is exciting and rewarding for you. We know you'll want to participate in all of this year's events, so make it easy on yourself (and on us) by joining up for the entire season.

The competition includes three ocean races and five that stay inside the Gate. There is something for everyone from the novice to the experienced trans-oceanic solo sailor. The season starts with the fun yet challenging Three Bridge Fiasco, peaks in the middle with the TransPac, and ends with the typically mellow Vallejo 1-2.

The Board strives to classify the boats in each race as fairly as possible. We continue to offer the non-spinnaker Class 5 which is designed to appeal to novices to shorthanded sailing and to people who just want to have a more relaxed sail. The SPORTBOAT class returns for a second year, using the same definition as the YRA Sportboat class. Finally, we've changed the class flags to a more logical sequence. Be sure you know which flag to look for at your warning signal!

Most SSS meetings are held at the Oakland Yacht Club. Thank you to the Bay Area Yacht Clubs who assist us in our programs: the Oakland YC, the Corinthian YC, the Golden Gate YC, the Richmond YC, the Vallejo YC, and the Half Moon Bay YC. Without the use of their race decks, committee boats, and other facilities there would be no program for you to compete in. Remember to thank them too.
